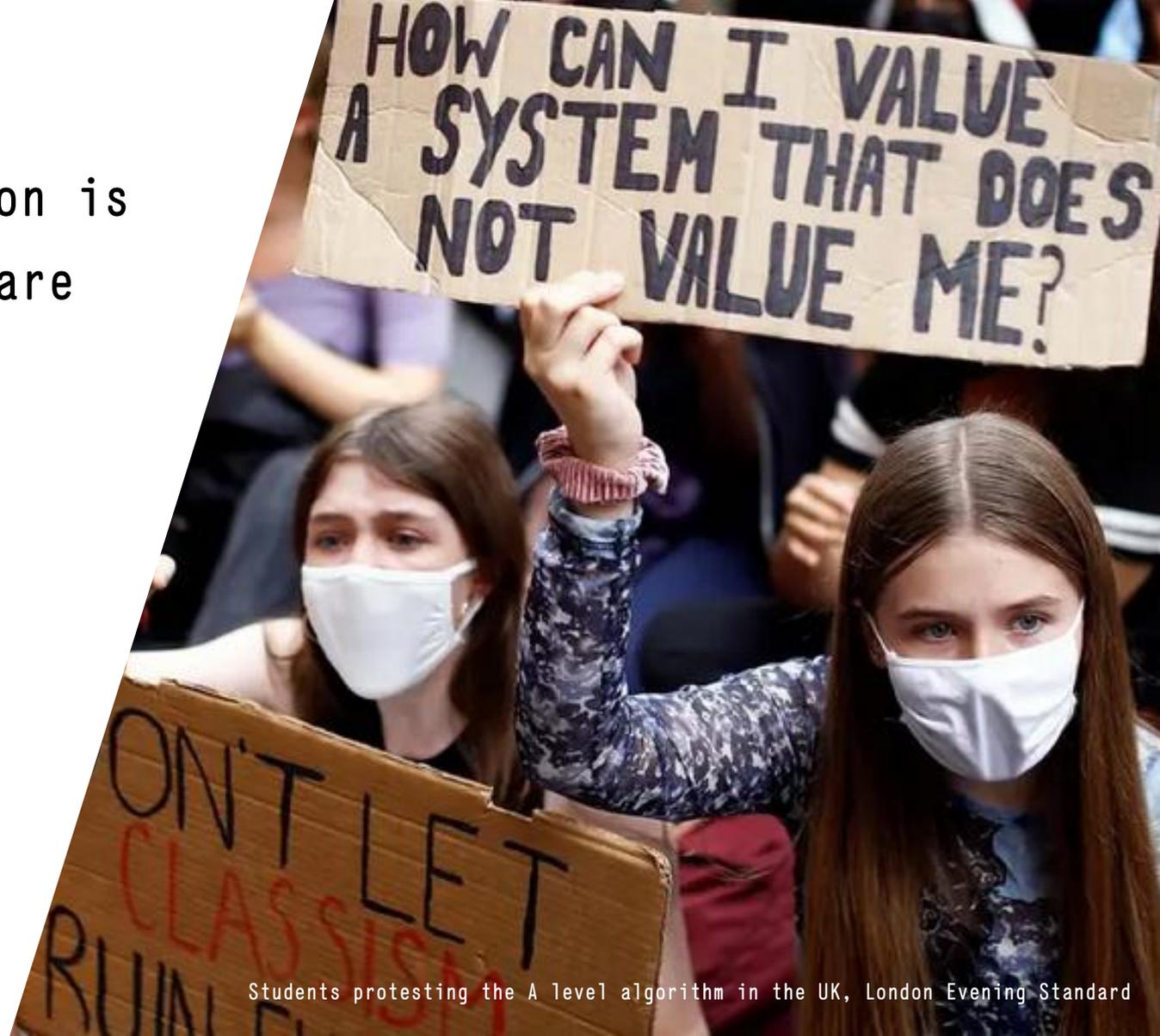


What the Future Wants

Developed with and designed for young people, this touring exhibition will be shown in schools, libraries and cultural centers across Europe, creating a critical space for young people to make demands of their digital futures.

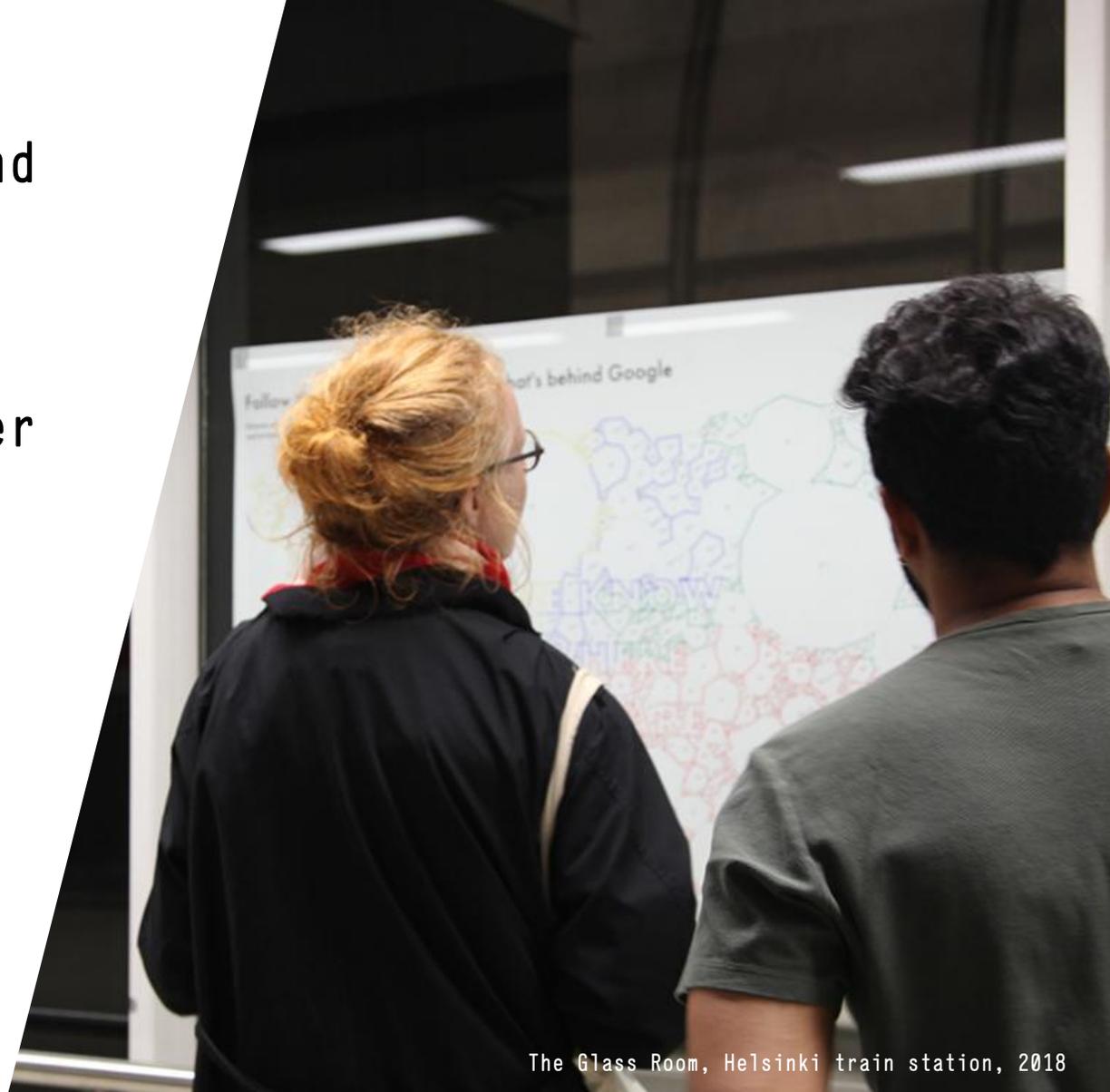
Since the project's inception in 2016, The Glass Room has been visited by close to 220,000 people. It has been hosted in 232 libraries, schools, organisations and events in 42 countries (and counting).

Through partnerships and community focused events, this project will create cross-border collaborations. What the Future Wants will be hosted at schools, libraries and youth serving projects across Europe.



An accompanying educational curricula based on Tactical Tech's Data Detox x Youth resource will support teachers to bring topics of critical data literacy into the classroom.



The What the Future Wants exhibition will be developed throughout 2021 and will launch early 2022. This project is part of Tactical Tech's ongoing youth initiative which aims to increase the data literacy of young people around the world.
